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Important Notices

- Towing: ALL vehicles without permits are subject to tow at owner's expense. Obtain visitor passes prior to overnight guest. Please bring in licenses and registration.
- Trash cans have been placed around communities to keep the property clean. The trash cans are for trash. Please do not put your personal garbage in these trash receptacles. Garbage is to be emptied in the dumpsters. Violators will be fined.



Maintenance Tips for Mildew Prevention



- Keep your home clean and dry.
- 2. Immediately report all issues related to water, such as leaky faucets, roofs, AC leaks and water heater leaks.
- 3. Moisture on windows: Anytime there is a drastic temperature difference between inside and outside, condensation will form on the windows. If the moisture is not addressed properly, it can cause mildew to grow. Wipe down the windows to remove the condensation (do NOT put a towel on the sill, that will cause even greater problems).
- 4. Run the AC system to help remove humidity. You can purchase a dehumidifier or DampRid to help remove humidity in the air. DampRid can be purchased at most retail stores in a plastic tub, and it will absorb moisture.
- 5. Run your bathroom fans during baths or showers to rid moisture. Also, you can run fans throughout day to help remove moisture.
- 6. You can also open your windows ¼ inch during the day.
- Open blinds/curtains during the day so air can circulate between the covering and windows.
- 8. Do NOT leave wet towels or wet clothes in a pile. Hang them on the towel bar or hook so they can dry.
- 9. While cooking, even boiling your favorite foods can create a lot of humidity which can cause damage to the cabinets and cabinet doors. You should run your AC system, turn on the exhaust fan, open a window or run a dehumidifier.

It starts with you! All these suggestions will help remove humidity, which in turn will help prevent any mildew issues.

KEEP CHAF CLEAN

We have noticed an increase amount of trash on some of the properties. Though we know that most residents do take pride in their community, unfortunately there are some who do not. Going forward we will be accessing a \$50.00 fee to resident's accounts if we find your trash on the ground, in the stairwells, by the dumpster and other visible areas. After the second violation and fee, your lease will not be renewed with CHAF Properties.

CHAF hopes that everyone will be mindful and encouraged to take pride in the community that you reside in and we hope we don't have to access any fees that can be easily avoided.

Please Keep in Mind

- Do not throw trash on the ground. Dispose of waste in the trash can distributed around your community and encourage others to do the same.
- When you see trash that somebody else left, pick it up and throw it away
- Volunteer to help keep the community clean.

Notes to Residents

CHAF wants your account to remain current. Communication and planning are essential in staying in your housing.

Take your housing seriously and consult with your leasing office before you are faced with an eviction notice.

AVOID AN EVICTION!!

- Evictions will show up on your background.
- Evictions stay on your public record.
- Evictions can damage your rental and credit history.
- If you have been evicted, it may be difficult to qualify for a new rental if a potential landlord checks your rental history.

Abiding by your rental agreement is the most important thing you can do to avoid being evicted. Your agreement is a legally binding contract.

Please understand everything that is expected of you, from maintenance of your property to noise restrictions and timely rent payment.

If you sell your vehicle, please provide the Bill of Sale and return the parking decal to your leasing office.

Old decals are not transferable and must be returned, even if it is damaged, or a \$25.00 fee is charged.

How to Report

This toll free number is available 24/7; counselors are waiting to assist you.

Phone Options

Press 1 to report suspected abuse, neglect or abandonment of a child

Press 2 to report suspected abuse, neglect or exploitation of the elderly or a vulnerable adult

Press 3 to verify the identity of a child protective investigator who recently visited you

Press 4 for information/referrals to other services in your local area.

Be prepared to provide specific descriptions of the incident(s) or the circumstances contributing to the risk of harm, including who was involved, what occurred, when and where it occurred, why it happened, the extent of any injuries sustained, what the victim(s) said happened, and any other pertinent information are very important. Information callers should have ready includes:

- Name, date of birth (or approximate age), race, and gender, for all adults and children involved.
- Addresses or another means to locate the subjects of the report, including current location.
- Information regarding disabilities and/or limitations of the victims (especially for vulnerable adult victims).
- Relationship of the alleged perpetrator to the child or adult victim(s).
- Other relevant information that would expedite an investigation, such as directions to the victim (especially in rural areas) and potential risks to the investigator, should be given to the Abuse Hotline Counselor.

Report Elder Abuse

The Florida Department of Elder Affairs is committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of the elders in Florida. The Department works in conjunction with the Department of Children and Families (DCF) Adult Protective Services and the Aging Network to protect disabled adults or elderly persons from further occurrences of abuse, neglect or exploitation. 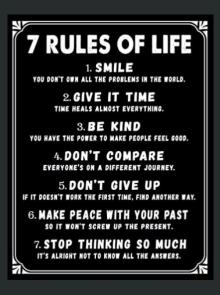

Memorial Day Best BBQ Chicken Ever!

1/2 cup Worcestershire sauce

- 1 teaspoon Cajun seasoning
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 ½ tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 ½ tablespoons ketchup
- 6 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves

Instructions Checklist

Step 1

In a large bowl, blend the Worcestershire sauce, Cajun seasoning, garlic powder, brown sugar, and ketchup. Place the chicken in the bowl, and coat thoroughly with the sauce mixture. Cover, and refrigerate 8 hours or overnight.

Step 2

Heat an outdoor grill for medium heat, and lightly oil grate.

Step 3

Discard the marinade, and grill chicken 6 to 8 minutes per side on the prepared grill, or until no longer pink and juices run clear.

Memorial Day Safety Tip

Grill/Fire Safety

Emergency care centers see their share of burn victims because of unsafe grilling or bonfire practices. If your weekend plans include grilling or sitting near an open fire, please keep these Memorial Day Safety Tips in mind:

- Never leave a grill or fire unattended, be mindful of the wind and extinguish all fires completely.
- Do not grill indoors, keep grills, bonfires, and fire pits away from low hanging branches and materials that can easily catch fire.
- Make sure your grill is properly cleaned before using it, clogged gas burners, and leftover grease can cause a fire to spiral out of control within seconds.
- When grilling, use the long handle utensils made especially for barbequing and keep an
 extinguisher nearby.
- Never add starter fuel to already ignited charcoal & ALWAYS keep children and pets away from the grill and fire pit.

*** Grills are to always be stored a minimum of 10 feet from any building and only allowed on floor units.
